Winter weather has definitely decided to appear here early this year!! The snow and the cold have definitely caused us to switch our equipment over to snow removal / salt spreading a little earlier than we anticipated. Hopefully we will still get some good weather to allow us to finish up the leaf pickup for the season and complete one more brush pickup in early December. At this point I do not want to give a final leaf pickup date as we will see how we do over the next week or two with the weather and the ability to clean up what is out there.

As mentioned above, snow removal activities have begun and a couple notes to help assist village employees in their efforts to provide safe roadways over this coming winter:

- Please be sure to recognize and provide ample room for the trucks as they plow snow, especially when working in the intersections. Leave plenty of room behind them as they do frequently back up to complete clean-up work.
- If you park on the street, please do your best to either relocate the car prior to the snow or as soon thereafter as possible so the crews can get things pushed back to allow for proper travel and parking.
- While village crews do an exceptional job getting out early and having things opened up prior to normal traffic, there are times, especially in the evenings, where we do not plow during the storm but instead wait until the snow has either tapered or quit. We try to best utilize our resources and time by doing this but it is important that traffic be aware of road conditions and take necessary precautions.
- As always, please remember to slow down during bad weather to ensure safety for everyone.
